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## **REPORT HIGHLIGHTS**

- ★ Commitments increased 11% from 7,399 in 2017 to 8,236 in 2018
  
- ★ Male Bookings increased 11% from 5,627 in 2017 to 6,218 in 2018
  
- ★ Female Bookings increased 14% from 1,772 in 2017 to 2,018 in 2018
  
- ★ Funds generated from Ordinance Charges decreased 41% from \$36,975 in 2017 to \$21,975 in 2018
  
- ★ The Average Daily Inmate Population increased .9% from 421 in 2017 to 425 in 2018
  
- ★ Inmate Releases increased 12% from 7,386 in 2017 to 8,261 in 2018
  
- ★ Inmate Meals Served decreased .9% from 452,444 in 2017 to 448,193 in 2018
  
- ★ Inmate Telephone Contributions increased 87% from \$170,882 in 2017 to \$320,343 in 2018
  
- ★ Inmate Welfare and Recreation Commissions increased 3% from \$135,235 in 2017 to \$138,803 in 2018
  
- ★ Funds Generated by the Inmate Work Release Program decreased 29% from \$25,136 in 2017 to \$17,768 in 2018
  
- ★ Continued Active Accreditation from the National Commission on Correctional Health Care.

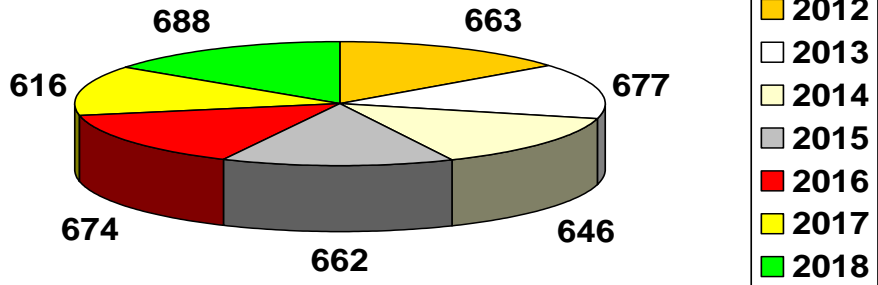

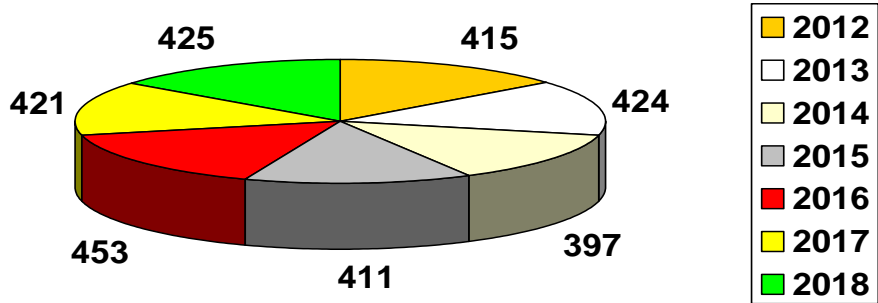
**AVERAGE MONTHLY INMATE RELEASE CHART**

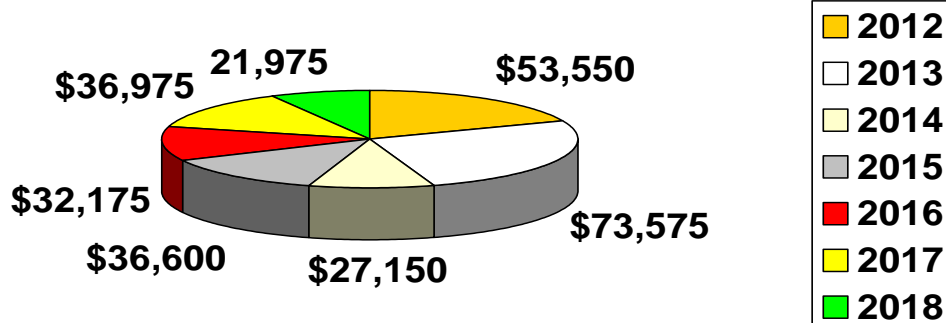

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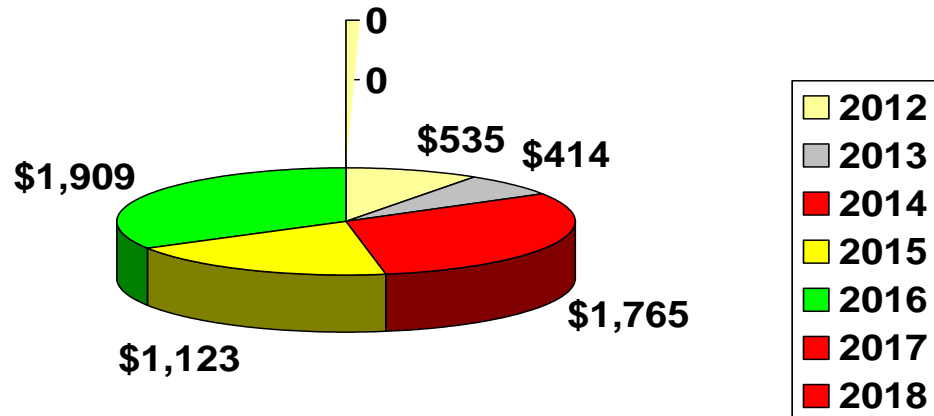


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### INMATE MEDICAL CO-PAY CHART

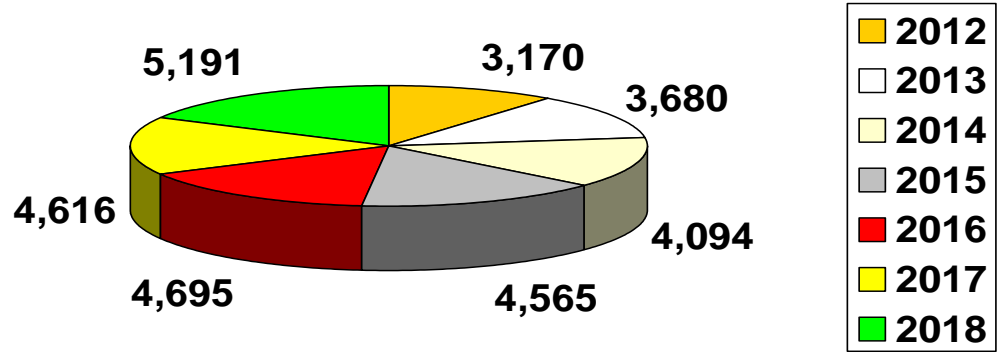

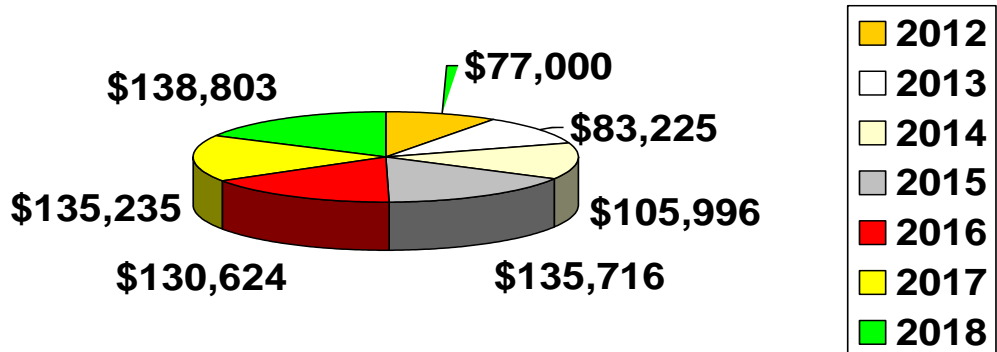
## INMATE WELFARE AND RECREATION COMMISSIONS CHART

The Lorain County Sheriff's Office has contracted ARAMARK Food Services to provide commissary to the inmate population. Inmates are permitted to purchase hygiene, writing, food items and other approved products. The Sheriff's Office earns 30% commission of the total items purchased weekly.

Per the Ohio Revised Code the commissions forwarded to the Lorain County Sheriff's Office are placed into a special inmate welfare and recreational account. Expenditures from the inmate welfare and recreational account may only be allocated for items that solely and directly benefit the inmate population.

Items routinely purchased from this account include: Drug and alcohol counseling services, books and educational material, indigent, hygiene and writing items, televisions, and exercise related items.

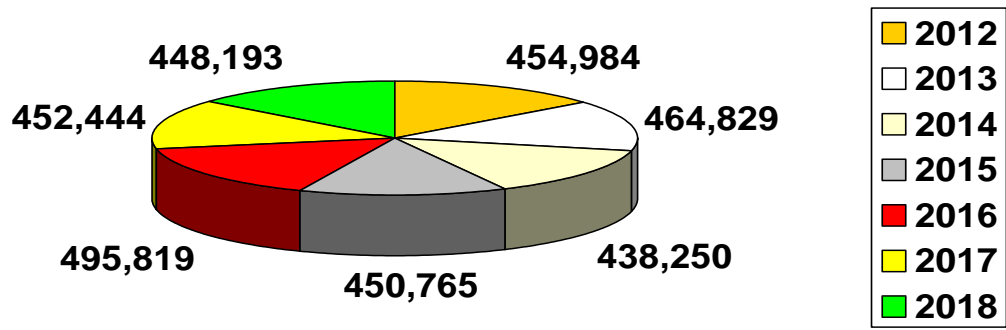


## INMATE MEALS SERVED CHART

Inmates are on a 2,800 calorie a day diet. Each meal costs approximately \$1.15 per inmate.

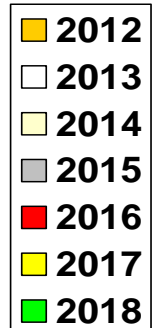
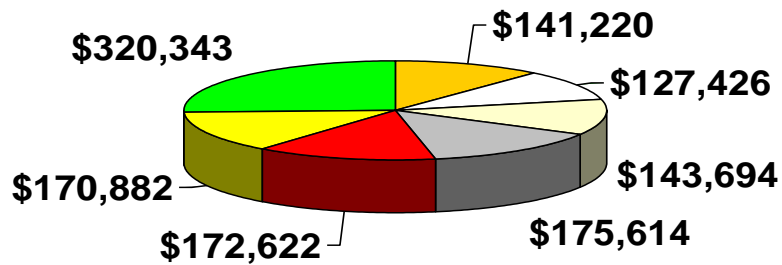

## INMATE WORK RELEASE CHART

Inmates sentenced to the work release program are permitted to maintain their employment by being allowed to leave the facility for scheduled work. Inmates are randomly checked by jail staff to assure they are at their place of employment .

Inmates who are accepted into the work release program are required to pay one hours wage per day to the Lorain County Sheriff's Office to help defray the cost of their incarceration.

\*Per the Ohio Revised Code any monies collected are placed into the Lorain County General Fund.
